Advocating for our Children's Education

We advocate for our military families working with Congress, White House, Department of Defense and other federal agencies.

Through effective communications and expert knowledge on pressing issues, we collaborate with military service organizations and other stakeholders to effect positive change for all military families. Children's education issues for 2024:

- Full Funding for ED & DoD Impact Aid Program
- Respond to individual military family concerns regarding the Interstate Compact for Educational Opportunity for Military Children and implementation.
- State Level: advanced and open enrollment options

Advocacy: Food Insecurity

Food Insecurity by the Numbers:

- DoD Surveys: 25% of military families report experiencing food insecurity in the previous 12 months
- Food pantries on or near every military installation

Our Policy Solutions:

- Increase families access to SNAP and BNA by removing BAH from eligibility
- Increase BAH to cover 100% of housing costs
- Targeted pay increase to junior enlisted (E1 to E4)

Hidden Helpers		
77% of respondents are Hidden Helpers.		
Wounded, III, or Injured Service Member Breakdown		
Injury Type	Percent %	Total (n)
None	24	381
Invisible	46	743
Visible	18	291
Both	13	205



Respondents with a service member with a **visible** wound were significantly more likely to report high and moderate well-being compared to those with a service member with an invisible wound.

Hidden Helpers and Suicidal Ideation

1 in 4 hidden helpers with a visibly wounded service member or a service member with both types of injuries reported passive SI in the past month.

70% of respondents with a service member with an invisible wound reported preparing to end their life at some time in their lifetime. Population crates of SI = 26% MTES lifetime SI = 38% Our Research + Insights team engages in research, data collection, and analysis to better understand the military community and generate meaningful insights in areas critical to military family well-being.

- Health
- Financial security
- Education employment
- Military children and teens






- 960 families registered with 1828 kids
