OneOp Overview

- Established in 2010 as the *Military Families Learning Network*.
- DoD/USDA partnership to provide research-based and evidence-informed programming and resources to service providers working across the Military Family Readiness System.
- DoD subject matter experts collaborate with land-grant universities to co-create programming.
- Over 58K live virtual event participants since 2012.
- Rebranded to OneOp in 2022.





2022 Metrics


2022 Year in Review

- 39 Live webinars
- 5,358 Live attendees
- 1,444 Certificates of attendance issued
- 7,802 Hours of on-demand webinars watched on YouTube
- 14,674 Continuing education credits certified

Average webinar attendance in 2022 increased by 4% compared to 2021.



Total continuing education credits certified in 2022 increased by 12% compared to 2021.



2022 Impact
